What? You live in Officer?

When you're at a BBQ and people ask where you live, it's highly likely that "Officer" will produce a few blank looks. Sounding more akin to an episode of The Bill than a Melbourne suburb, Officer got its name from the Officer family who were early pastoralists in the area.

Despite Officer's growing population and booming housing market, the suburb remains relatively unknown among people who don't live close by, and our sales team at Arcadia get plenty of questions on what it's like living in Officer.

Ten things you might not know about Officer.

ONE: Officer's Gum Scrub
Creek is an example of award-winning
environmental restoration. It was
recognised at the Australian Institute
of Landscape Architects (AILA) state
awards in 2015 as the winner of the land
management category. It was described
as "an agricultural drain" changing "into a
meandering creek system".



TWO: Officer is home to an unclaimed fortune. TattsLotto is still on the lookout for a resident or visitor who bought a ticket at Arena Lucky Lotto on Christmas Eve last year. The prize a cool \$757,320.06.

THREE: House prices are going up. The median sales price for houses in Officer in the last year was \$425,000 based on 137 sales. That's a 117.9% over five years, which equates to a compound annual growth rate of 16.9%.

SEVEN: Officer Primary School turned 130 last year. In its first year its single classroom accommodated 20 children and one teacher.



EIGHT: Gum Scrub Creek Primary School is coming. The new primary school, plus an integrated early learning centre, will be designed to accommodate long-term student enrolments of 475 students with a peak enrolment of up to 900 students. The expected completion date is late this year.
