

# 8 easy ways to outsmart a thief

- Keep your doors, windows and garage locked even when you're home.
- Carry your garage remote with you. Don't leave it in your car.
- Put your valuables where they can't be seen from outside.
- 4. Keep your keys out of sight and in a spot a thief wouldn't think to look.
- Cut up boxes from new TVs, laptops and game consoles and put them in the recycling bin.
- Install motion sensor lights around your home and garage and keep lights on at night.

# 5 things you can do to help stop illegal dumping

- Fence your block to deter people from entering your property.
- Ask your builder to install a security camera until handover.
- 3. Find out how any potential builders intend to remove and recycle their building rubbish.
- 4. Report dumped rubbish to your property developer, your local council and the EPA at epa.vic.gov.au
- If you see someone dumping rubbish and they're till around, call Triple Zero (000). If they've gone, report it to Victoria Police on 131 444 or to Crime Stoppers anonymously on 2800 333 000).

Rubbish that's dumped illegally affects everyone.

It can make your neighbourhood look unappealing, damage the environment, encourage more crime and be a public safety risk. And it spoils the natural beauty of our community.







## 7 steps to stay ahead of scams

- 1. Don't share your personal or bank info.
- Delete suspicious texts messages and emails and don't answer calls from unknown numbers.
- 3. Don't click on suspicious links or attachments.
- Check the email or web address against the company's legit ones.
- Make sure the website's address bar has a padlock symbol and starts with "https".
- Choose passwords that use a mix of upper and lower case letters, numbers and symbols.
- Verify the offer or request with the company using an email or phone number you have sourced yourself.
